"A Man of Sorrows and Acquainted with Grief"

The truly magnificent "A Man of Sorrows and Acquainted with Grief" was the appropriate emotional and lyrical highlight to the 50th Anniversary Gala concert of the Swaledale Festival which was held in the ancient and stately Ripon Cathedral on Saturday 28th May 2022. 1350 years ago, St. Wilfred would have approved. grand exposition of Handel's Messiah was very ably performed by the Swaledale Festival Chorus and Orchestra conducted by Peter Stallworthy and led by four excellent professional soloists Zoe Brookshaw (soprano), William Towers (alto/ counter-tenor), Nicholas Pritchard (tenor) and Nicholas Mogg (bass). The singing was of a high professional

The singing was of a high professional standard which was well articulated and able to take full

advantage of the specific resonance of the main body of the cathedral building. This allowed the full beauty and appropriate quality in today's context

of Charles Jennens 1741 biblical text to be experienced. This was exemplified, surprisingly, in the Recitatives performed by the soloists in dramatic fashion with suitable improvisations and tonal qualities which transmuted what are often performance add-ons to vital linkages

in this emotive and lively performance. All the soloists were clear and well-heard by the large 500-600 members of the audience yet the exceptional authority and dignitas of body-language stamped onto the rendering of the bass solo part by Nicholas Mogg was well noted by all. However, the clear talk amongst the cognoscenti at the completion was of the stunning performance of the alto William Towers who is a Handelian specialist and rightly so.

It was pleasing to note that the singing of the Swaledale Festival Chorus was well balanced with distinctly audible tenor and alto sections. Some more strong basses amongst the men would have helped in the *forte* sections in which the straight trumpets and timpani were vital stimuli to the choir as a whole. Also, of note, were the cellos and double bass whose rich timbre and dark notes were caught and

magnified by the building's resonance throughout the performance of the orchestra, which was splendidly conducted by Peter Stallworthy. The opening gala concert of this

familiar and well-loved work was indeed well worthy of the Festival's 50th anniversary and further promulgated the continuing high standard at national level of musical performance and appreciation in the Yorkshire Dales.

I'm not the only one: how many times have you been in a charity shop and seen BNWT (that's Brand New With Tags) items for sale?

Other less fortunate pieces of clothing, often damaged due to poor manufacturing, end up in landfill or are transported overseas to become another country's problem.

The cost to the environment from our obsession with fashion is not just landfill. Manufacturing processes, like dying denim, cause pollution in countries less able to handle its detrimental effects

Sweat shops, involved in the manufacture of fast fashion, exploit the people who make our cheap clothes

So, you say, we need to wear clothes, do you want us to go round naked? Definitely not! Clothes are an essential part of being human, they make us feel good as well as protecting us.

Part of the solution to the problems I have mentioned is re-use.

You can buy good quality, well made, used clothing that you like. It does take a bit more searching and well, that is part of the fun, isn't it? You might just enjoy saving the planet and some money.

Matters Arising:

Buttertubs Signage - The erection of signage is more complicated than first thought. It would be necessary to conduct a risk assessment and take out insurance in case an accident should occur. This was considered too onerous for the Parish council. The Clerk to contact Ian Beighton, Highways, to see if a small sign could be erected on the wall.

Buttertubs Bench - The unauthorised bench has now been removed by persons unknown, therefore no longer a matter for the Council.

Queens Platinum Jubilee - Following a number of meetings a party is to be held at Keld Hall/Orchard/Field 2pm on Friday 3rd June 2022 primarily for children, but all are welcome. A second event for all persons will be held in Muker at 2pm Sunday 5th June 2022. Response from MP Rishi Sunak re BT voice digitalisation - BT and the government are fully aware that BT voice prevents use of a telephone during applications a power cut. BT are trying to develop a long term solution, in the meantime BT have offered a temporary Battery Back Up Unit (BBU) for customers with digital service, for use during power cuts.

Keld Defibrillator pads expire 28 April.

Clerk to order and install new pads.

Finance:

Order to pay for Zurich Insurance, YLCA membership and Clerk's Pay.

Highways:

No updates received from Highways, however it is noted drains at bottom of Cliff Gate Road, Thwaite have been ietted.

Cllr Calvert reported that heavy rains in February have washed away the sides of the road between Hoggarths and Pry House causing vehicles to ground. Clerk to report to Highways. Also, on Silver Hill from Tan Hill, it is difficult for motorists to see sharp downhill right hand bend. Wall mounted Chevrons would provide warning of a sharp bend. Clerk to contact Highways. Further damage was caused at Hoggarths bridge on the morning of Tuesday 29th March 2022 by a large goods vehicle. The driver claimed his SatNav had directed him that way. Cllr Calvert reported the incident to the police who disinclined to take further action despite having the registration mark of the vehicle. Clerk to report this to Highways, North Yorkshire Police and potentially MP Rishi Sunak.





We also felt we could raise money for various charities at the same time for local people who have been affected by a loss or specific disease. My family has suffered a huge loss this year due to Pancreatic Cancer so raising money for charity is at the centre of this festival."

The festival offers a diverse mix of music styles from folk, rock and jazz through to close harmony and brass. There will be regular favourites making a return such as Ginger Brown and The Blackthorns, with some great newcomers to widen the appeal of the Festival.



'Contemporary twist' on Dales textiles heritage

Artists from Harrogate have picked up the threads of the rich textiles heritage of the Dales to stage a special exhibition at the <u>Dales Countryside</u> <u>Museum</u> in Hawes.

Known as The Small Group, eight artists are showing their vibrant works in 'Dales, Land and Sky – Contemporary Textiles'.

The special exhibition is designed to complement the museum's permanent textiles gallery,

which displays ancient knitting sheaths, rag rugs and quilts. The artists have used the same techniques as can be seen in the permanent collection, but with a contemporary twist.

The Small Group has exhibited at more than 20 venues since 1991, including at Halifax's Piece Hall in 2012, but this is the first time the group has held a show in the Yorkshire Dales National Park.

'Dales, Land and Sky - Contemporary Textiles' will run until 10 July and includes a wide variety of Dalesinspired works for sale. Kevin Frea, who is Member Champion for Promoting Understanding at the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, which runs the Dales Countryside Museum, said: "The Yorkshire Dales National Park has always produced or inspired artists and we are delighted with 'Dales, Land and Sky - Contemporary Textiles'. It's a vibrant and varied textile exhibition exploring different aspects of the beautiful Dales landscape.


"Landforms and dwellings, plants in the wild or cultivated in gardens, living creatures which make their home here and the words found in dialect poetry have all provided a source of inspiration. A stimulating experience awaits at the Dales Countryside Museum."

Most members of The Small Group met whilst studying City and Guilds Embroidery courses and some teach at colleges or privately. The group meets regularly to exchange ideas. Eight members - Margaret Bush, Catherine Chew, Irene Earl, Jacquelyn Estell, Kathy Hammond, Gill Kirk, Diane Freeman and Jo Linley - are showing work at the museum.

The Dales Countryside Museum is open seven days a week. Weekly tickets are £4.80, an Annual or Family Pass is £9 and entry to the special exhibition is included in the admission price. Children are admitted free.

An Update on Church Bells

Following our original article, a group of local volunteers, led by Sam Johnson and Paul Brown, has taken on the clockwinding duties in order to continue the tradition as long as possible and to maintain the clockworks in their original condition.

This is great news as it immediately reduces the capital needed to maintain the bell tower in good condition for regular use.

However, as always when dealing with old buildings, new issues have come to light and the main beam holding in place the east side of the ringing room floor looks to be in need of replacement or, at least, to have a metal shoe placed over a substantial part of the southern end of the beam and for the beam to be raised a few inches to properly support and level the floor of the ringing chamber.

As we are keeping the original workings of the clock in place, the weights need to be properly boxed in with access points to allow maintenance and to provide a reasonably controlled environment for the clock workings.

Our recruitment drive for additional bell ringers has added four new members to the group who are all helping to develop our repertoire and to keep our ringing tradition alive. Chris Atkin, the tower captain and Chris Curry, the ringing master and the other ringers would welcome anyone who is thinking of trying this rewarding pastime. Our eight bells sound great when they can all be rung together.

The Wensleydale and Swaledale ringers are offering to run online courses again

for introducing beginners to bell ringing after the excellent response earlier this year. Over 26 new ringers have been recruited in Wensleydale and Swaledale and are continuing to ring in their respective towers.



North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service

If the sun comes out or you've been watching Wim Hoff, you might fancy 'wild swimming'. There's a local group that go regularly. Apparently nobody pays them to jump into cold water, they just do it for fun! Stay safe!

Reeth Station

A bit of housekeeping to start the month of June off for us.

Getting all the lengths of hoses rolled out and pressured up with water to 10 Bar then checked for any leaks. All the kit on the appliance is subject to multiple checks on a weekly and monthly basis; kit keeps the crew safe and saves lives, but only if it works!

Have your say on the proposed changes to Fire and Rescue services in North Yorkshire

North Yorkshires PFCC (police fire and crime commissioner) has launched a 3 month consultation to listen to the public's views on proposed changes to fire and rescue services ahead of making her final decisions.

The proposals are based on an extensive risk assessment across north Yorkshire and York covering likelihood and severity of fires, road traffic collisions, water related incidents and other emergencies.

The proposal specifically relates to Harrogate, Scarborough and the York area however does involve looking at a large investment into boosting the availability of the on-call area of the service and ensuring day time availability for their crews.

To take part in the survey scan the QR code opposite with your smart phone camera or search for the link to the website, scroll down and click on the link "start survey now" or search online for PFCC and follow the links to the survey.

Respect the Water!

We've got some cracking rivers and becks around us, and whether you've gone for a wild swim, a little paddle, or you've slipped on a banana skin and fallen in, if you get in trouble or you see someone struggling call 999 and ask for the Fire Service. We are trained in water rescue and if serious enough will turn up alongside our colleagues in the Mountain Rescue to lend a hand.

If you're planning on going in the water

- Stick together—swim with someone or have someone on shore who can call for help
- Read the signs—if a landowner has put up warning signs for deep water or fast flowing water pay attention to them
- Acclimatise—Cold water shock kills, jumping or diving into cold water causes the body's temperature to decrease rapidly making it difficult to breathe and swim

If you find someone in distress

- Shout for help
- Look for rescue equipment nearby
- Never enter the water yourself, otherwise you compromise your own safety
- Call 999 and ask for the fire service
- Consider having the What3words App on your phone so you can assist emergency services in locating you



Sustainable Swaledale

Meadows

The Yorkshire Dales area is noted for its beautiful meadows and no more so than Arkengarthdale and Swaledale. Although generally best in June, there is still time to visit the meadows. Wildflower meadows can be seen at Gunnerside Bottoms. the Muker Meadows, the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust's Yellands Meadow Reserve. Richmond Race Course and Round Howe, and Hudson House garden has a glorious wildflower patch.

According to the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust the dales contain about a sixth of the UK's remaining upland hay meadows, supporting up to 120 species of wildflowers and grasses per field and providing vital habitat for pollinators

Protecting peatlands

New technology is being used to monitor heather burns on peat using satellite imaging. Burning of heather is prohibited if the peat depth is greater than 40cm - at which point it is designated peatland. The technology will help ensure compliance - a process supported by landowners' associations. The government has called England's peatlands its "national rainforests" due to the amount of carbon they store so peat degradation has consequences for climate change.

The Bog Garden, which won a gold medal at this year's Chelsea Flower Show, highlighted the critical importance of UK peatlands for climate change and urged gardeners to ditch peat. Plenty of peat free alternatives can be found at our local independent garden centres and the Co-op. Look out for those using local ingredients such as wool eg Dalefoot compost rather than imported coconut fibre.

An **exhibition** on peatlands starts at the Dales Countryside Museum 16 July running through to 9 October. Called "Give Peat a chance" it looks at the formation of peat, the wildlife supported, how actions have impacted them and restoration efforts - all explored through visual arts, music and film.



On average we respond to between 50 to 60 calls each year.

Incident 18: 09/06/2022: While writing this article we were called by the Ambulance service to rescue an injured walker in Hackfall Woods, near Masham. The casualty was evacuated from steep ground & carried to the road ambulance by the team.

Incident 17: 07/06/2022: Team called by the Ambulance Service following reports of a collapsed walker in Gunnerside Gill. Team members on scene within 6 mins of the call. Despite the best efforts of passersby, locals, ambulance crews & ourselves the casualty was pronounced dead & once the Police had arrived, we

evacuated to the Ambulance. A valiant effort by everyone.

Incident 16: 02/06/2022: Called by the Police to search for a missing person in the Preston Under Scar area. Following a night search by team, police dogs and helicopter, the missing person turned up safe this morning.

Incident 15: 11/05/2022: Team called to rescue an injured walker near the stepping stones between Aysgarth Falls & Redmire Falls.

Incident 14: 10/05/2022: Team called this afternoon to Whitecliffe Scar area near Applegarth. Requested by the Police and Ambulance service to assist with the rescue of an injured person in a tricky location.

TOP GUN—MAVERICK Review by John Hunter

Let's start with the pre-flight....Lots of fast flying footage and general mayhem, Jerry Bruckheimer style? ... Check. Issues to resolve from the first film?....Check. An 'aging' hero who still looks fabulous topless?...Check. We

could go on of course, but Tom Cruise's new actioner 'Maverick' ticks all the boxes and more. For a self-confessed film buff, I have to admit to never having sat through the original 'Top Gun' (though I do have

a book explaining how the then-cutting edge miniature work was achieved!) but should you be similar (or have a short celluloid memory) - fear not, as any reference to earlier plot links are explained in the dialogue and supported by actual footage from the first movie. Opening with our hero 'Maverick' air testing a new Mach 10 superplane (a project then immediately scrapped), he then finds himself tasked with training a new squadron of young 'aces' for an important mission 'overseas' to destroy a new 'Uranium' store (before the Uranium actually arrives of course). In a strange amalgam of the finales from 'Star Wars' and '633 squadron' (the latter did indeed influence the former) our intrepid flyers have to negotiate a treacherous ravine, fire missiles into a hole then attempt a multi-G climb to escape - all at zero level to avoid radar etc. The clichés come thick and fast throughout (as one might expect), but credit to the scriptwriters for some believable dialogue and situations.

Apparently 800 hours of flying footage were collected to ensure all of the visceral aerial scenes were covered from every angle, including cockpit shots looking backwards at the various actors actually flying in the planes (in certain scenes). Tom Cruise himself designed a unique bootcamp for the

actors, going through three months of training - underwater evacuation, aerial aviation and the preliminary training to build spatial awareness inside the aircraft, and flights.

producer Bruckheimer said that "The actors also had to learn how to run the cameras because when they're up in the jet they have to direct themselves essentially."

Rounding out the cast are Ed Harris as a grizzly Rear Admiral, Miles Teller as 'Rooster', the son of Maverick's late best friend and Jennifer Connelly as an old girlfriend of Maverick. Anthony Edwards and Meg Ryan also appear via flashbacks. Orchestral soundtrack music is courtesy of Hans Zimmer, incorporating Harold Faltermeyers' original Top Gun theme, and the title song is from Lady Gaga.

The final question - is it any good? - well, I thoroughly enjoyed almost every second of it - a satisfying 'popcorn' epic in every respect. I would recommend seeing this on a large screen with full cinema sound which accurately captures the noise (and feel) of all those carrier launches!

We would like to thank the Platinum Jubilee Committee for inviting the Museum to participate in the celebrations on Reeth Green on 2nd June. What a fabulous day it was for both young and old and all of us inbetween. We had some splendid 1950s objects brought into our tent - two handkerchiefs with snazzy designs specially made for the Coronation, a splendid cake knife with red and blue inlaid inserts, which by chance went with a cake tin that someone else brought in. Then there was an object that stumped almost everyone - a brown ceramic butter bell. Now we all want one to keep our butter cool. We were surprised by α splendid Coronation mug; it was the only one brought to us! It came from West Yorkshire, but we let it in. Everyone loved a beautiful pair of little scissors engraved with a crown, brought in by the granddaughter of the owner, with a little personal note. Then there was a wonderful archive of commemorative literature that covered not only the Accession and Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II, but also of the monarchs before and after, a real treasure trove. We particularly liked the scrapbook, made by the owner when a little girl, full of news cuttings, but what makes it special are the lovely naive drawings of the Queen and family. Memorial Hall. Helen gave this lecture to a packed house, and a standing ovation, as part of the Swaledale Festival Now is chance your to hear it - for half




Friend of the Museum, for even less! We are so lucky to have Helen with us. and much admire her work at the Keld Heritage Centre.

You might also be interested in the August talks. Dr David Johnson on 'Lime kilns in Swaledale Arkengarthdale: the where, the when and the what for?' on Wednesday 3rd August. David had to cancel this talk back in 2018 due to illness, then there was the Flood of 2019, and then the Plague - so fourth time lucky.



Next, we have the rare privilege of welcoming back Prof William van Vugt from Grand Rapids talking about his book (copies of which we hope to have

for the evening for him to sign) 'Portrait of English Migration: North Yorkshire People in North America' on Wednesday 17th August. Some of might you remember that he gave a lecture on this project in its early stage, in the



Museum - at which several of the audience brought letters of their Swaledale forebears written from America.

A NEW EVENT which has just been organised is a Field Trip to Gunnerside on Saturday 16th July led by our very own energetic and super-knowledgeable Richard Lamb, (who gave the lecture on Barney Beck last month) and our archaeologist favourite Richardson (who will give us a lecture on 28th September). There are only 25 places. This all-day tour is designed to introduce the topography and former industries of this northern tributary of the River Swale to those up for a challenge. It encompasses walking mainly on public footpaths, which can be pretty uneven, through some very narrow stiles, both up- and downhill, although avoids crossing the Gill unless water levels are sufficiently low. Briefly, we will climb from the village up to Potting, pass below Whin Hall and

above Winterings before dropping down into the valley to see the Francis workings at Sir including the introduction of the then technology. Continuina upstream we come to Bunton Level with its smithy, bouse teams (ore storage bins) and ore dressing equipment including a waterwheeldriven crusher, a most convenient place to have lunch. Further up we come to Blakethwaite smelting mill. the only survivor of two mills, displaying an unusual method of furnace arch support, and a truly incredible flue arrangement. here the intrepid can explore higher up to examine the two Blakethwaite Dams, the upper showing the curious mode of construction revealed after the 2019 flood damage. The return journey is, after a gentle rise, downhill and provides an excellent vantage overlook point to morning's perambulations. En route



features of interest will be pointed out and explained. The route has been chosen particularly to allow spectacular viewpoints over the valley giving comprehension

of the landscape and its former mineral exploitation. £25 for the day for Friends of the Museum, £35 for visitors. More informaton and booking from Helen, see contact details at the Museum overleaf.

We have just had the Bothroyd (also spelt Boothroyd or Botheroyd) clock restored to working order. It is exciting to hear it tick and chime, the first time for many decades, if not a century. This 30-hour long case clock was made by James Bothroyd (1812-75). In the mid-1800s, Reeth, like many towns and villages in the Dales had its own clockmaker. James Bothroyd was born in Crakehall and first appears in Reeth in the 1841 Census as a 'clockmaker' aged 25, living on High Row, with his wife Ann (1816-89) and three sons, Richard (1833-83), James (b.1838) and John (b.1842). It is unlikely that the Bothroyds would have made all the parts of the clocks themselves. The movements and dials would have been purchased wholesale. probably from the Midlands. The cases are very much in the Yorkshire style, tall (7ft 6 inches) and wide (26 inches) and possibly came from Halifax. The heyday of the Bothroyds would appear to have been between 1841 and 1860 when the business was able to support father, a son and apprentice. By 1871 James Bothroyd was a 'watchmaker and farmer', reflecting the decline in demand for these large and by then unfashionable long case clocks. Come to the Museum to see ours! Do you have one?
