





The Future of the 2 Dales Luncheon Clubs Association

Despite extensive enquiries within the 2 Dales community it has proved impossible to find a replacement caterer to supply meals to the Lunch *Clubs*.

In these circumstances. an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Luncheon Clubs Association will be held in Reeth Memorial Hall at 10:00 am on Wednesday 14th September to approve a motion to the Luncheon dissolve Clubs Association and distribute its assets in accordance with clause 11 of the constitution

It is proposed that the available Cash assets will be distributed in equal share between the 4 public halls that were used to host the lunch clubs prior to the pandemic. It is also proposed that material assets such as table cloths, cutlery etc will be left in the halls where they are currently kept, but with the exception that the recently acquired Langthwaite cutlery would be donated to the proposed new kitchenette that it is hoped will become a community facility within St. Mary's Church Langthwaite. All current and recent members of all 4 lunch clubs are invited to attend the meeting and vote on the proposed dissolution There will also be the opportunity to discuss whether there is any alternative option to fulfil the original aims of the Luncheon Clubs Association, and to appoint a new committee and/or administrator if one is deemed necessary.



Catterick town levelling up bid submitted

A £19 million bid for funding to revamp a neglected area of Catterick, and expand the existing town centre, has been lodged.

Richmondshire District Council - in partnership with North Yorkshire County Council and the MOD - has submitted an application to central government's Levelling Up Fund.

It details ambitious proposals for the £21 million initial phase of a regeneration programme for enhancing Catterick town centre. This includes the re-development of land around Shute Road to provide more community facilities and space and to improve pedestrian connectivity.

If successful it should pave the way for further improvements that will deliver extra retail and commercial premises, and drive further investment into the area and the wider town centre for both the military and civilian communities.

"We want to see Shute Road and the area around it transformed into an attractive, vibrant and inclusive town centre," said District Council Leader, Councillor Angie Dale.

"They are very exciting plans for the town. A new town square with a community and enterprise facility and the rejuvenation of Coronation Park will bring in more businesses and therefore more people giving the town centre the focus it doesn't currently

have."

She said the plans include:

- a new town square
- landscaping improvements including upgrading Coronation Park and Shute Road by providing enhanced play / active spaces as well as enhanced accessibility routes linking into the existing town centre
- enhancing key footpaths and cycle ways through Coronation Park and on the approach to the town centre
- a new community and enterprise facility with glass pavilion and outdoor seating area

North Yorkshire County Council's leader, Cllr Carl Les, who represents the Catterick Village and Brompton-ondivision previously Swale and represented the entire Catterick Garrison, said: "The Levelling Up Fund provides the opportunity to introduce wide-ranging improvements in areas of the country which are often most in need

"We have worked closely with our colleagues at Richmondshire District Council and the Ministry of Defence to draw up the bid which, if approved, will be of huge benefit to Catterick and the surrounding area for years to come."

Major General Richard Clements, Director Basing and Infrastructure says: "The Army is very supportive of the regeneration of Catterick town centre, and a successful bid will provide the funding to deliver the joint vision for the town. Delivering the right infrastructure is key to encouraging investment in what will be a vibrant community that will greatly benefit our serving personnel, their families, and the wider civilian community."

The Levelling Up Bid develops

feasibility work that was jointly funded by the district council, MoD and the North Yorkshire and York Local Enterprise Partnership - and is also linked to the Catterick Garrison Masterplan that has been considered through the Richmondshire Local Plan Review.

North Yorkshire County Council agreed on 20 July to explore the establishment of a climate emergency committee to provide an added level of scrutiny for its work to tackle climate change. A decision will be made at the November meeting.

County, district and borough council staff are currently working on a draft climate change strategy which will cover the whole of North Yorkshire when the new authority takes over on 1st April 2023. The strategy will cover measures to reduce North Yorkshire's carbon dioxide emissions.

Run from the Shadows Art Exhibition

"Run from the Shadows" is the first exhibition by Julie Edwardson since her move to the Dales last Spring to open Yore Mill Gallery with her partner Steve, which fulfils a lifelong ambition. Julie had been an art teacher in the North East of England since '87 and since leaving teaching has been a member of The Bank Art Group in North Shields having two exhibitions with the group in 2019 and 2020.

Julie is drawn to details in the landscape working mainly with acrylic paint and mixed media collage taking inspiration from nature and the effects of man on the landscape.



Since moving to the Dales, Julie has been intrigued by the play of light

through the trees particularly falling onto man made forms. She responds to the sights and sounds of the environment and expresses the mood of the local area in gesture and colour. Julie hopes to evoke the sounds of the dales through these abstracted images such as the play of water over stones and the breeze through the trees. She is attracted to the points where nature and humans collide, textures and contrasts.

Julie uses mixed media collage and acrylic paint to achieve a textured layered images through transparent and opaque media achieving depth and subtlety in tone and colour.

Hopefully you will be able to visit the Gallery here at Aysgarth Falls to enjoy these exciting new works by Julie. The exhibition runs from 1st August until 31st October 2022.

Vocals are courtesy of Gracie Will, who has also starred in several musicals locally and further afield.



THANK YOU! Melbecks Emergency Plan Update

You may all remember that earlier in the year Melbecks PC published a Community Emergency Plan (CEP) that it had been developing. In conjunction with that launch and following the Power outages due to Storm Arwen, an appeal was launched to purchase a Standby Generator which would supply the Low Row Institute should we face such an Emergency (as is highly likely in the current uncertain economic and environmental climates) in the future.

I am delighted to report that not only were the funds raised, but the Generator was successfully linked to the Low Row Institute's mains board on Tuesday 26^{th} July, and 12 volunteers attended who are now able to connect and start the Generator in times of crisis.

I would like to offer my HUGE thanks to all the Volunteers in the Melbecks Emergency Volunteer Group for giving up their time for the Community, and also to everyone who made the acquisition of this community asset possible.

In particular, I wish to thank the Hudson House Committee for their outstanding donation of £400 towards the purchase of the Generator, and also to everybody who generously donated enough funds to cover not only the remaining Generator purchase costs, but also the cost of altering the institute electrical system to accept the Generator. (Thank you to Michael Guy for carrying out the electrical work). We are now able to activate the CEP ourselves and hit the ground running locally, saving hours of valuable time waiting for the Emergency and Blue light services to attend the situation. Indeed, the volunteers received their first BE PREPARED call on 18th July 2022 from the NYCC Resilience Emergency Team in response to the heatwave.

Within hours our high-risk vulnerable people had been contacted to see if they required any assistance or were in difficulty; thank you again to the Volunteer group. In short, the system worked.

*Please note Vulnerable people can also register with Northern Power Grid and Yorkshire Water in order to receive help and priority assistance, and I would highly recommend this. Please seek help from your local councillors if you need any help in doing this.

Our next task is to finalise the plans for Sandbag stores in Low Row and Gunnerside, followed by training in the role of Emergency Coordinator for our Volunteers (1st September) in turn followed by Emergency First Aid and use of Defibrillator training. It is then hoped to run a full exercise and 'Stress Test' the plan.

We will know how effective the CEP is only when it is used in anger so to speak, and I am sure that there will be errors on the journey and mistakes that will need to be addressed before the plan is in any way near perfect. We have, however, made a fantastic start! THANK YOU once more, to everyone for your time and financial assistance in this project.

The Arts Society Wensleydale presents "Collections of Peter the Great and Catherine the Great"

Both these early rulers of "modern" Russia were voracious collectors but in different directions and for different reasons, and this is explored in this lecture by **Nicholas Merchant**.

Peter the Great, with his enormous animal energy and enquiring mind was a collector of curiosities and oddities.



Indeed, the first "museum" of St Petersburg, which still stands on the banks of the Neva, is not the Hermitage, as might be supposed, but the Kunstkammer built by Peter in 1718. In this building are housed works of art not necessarily for themselves, but because they satisfied Peter's quest for the outlandish, unusual and bizarre. More likely to be found are items of scientific use, medical specimens, minerals and zoological items.

Catherine was the founder of the Russia art collections that millions now swarm to see from all corners of the globe. Like Peter her curiosity was insatiable, but unlike him she scoured Europe for collections of paintings to buy, that of the cash strapped Walpoles at Houghton being a case in point. She commissioned porcelain from France and England, as well as sculpture, silver, furniture and jewels and she corresponded with Voltaire. Her interests were varied and extravagant.

In both cases their collecting urges were based on the acquisition of all the myriad of "new" ideas they found



in the west, and their lust to have them for the emergent Russia.



Together For Trees

Together For Trees is running again this year, with a dozen or so new sites to be planted over the coming winter.

Last year, eleven community-scale sites were planted after local landowners came forward and offered their sites, and with the help of around forty local volunteers, over three thousand trees were planted between December and March.

All the sites were monitored for treehealth in June and survival rate at that time was over 97%.

As long as sites are carefully assessed, planting trees offers a wide range of benefits: flood management, water quality, food production and carbon sequestration are all improved by appropriate tree planting, and trees provide important habitats for nature as well as adding landscape value. So it's great news that we are able to roll the project over into a second year - this time supported by Tees-Swale: naturally connected as well as private dedications.

The map below shows last year's sites and this year's new sites which include small groves, hedges and wood pasture, all in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale.

Many of last year's volunteers came out multiple times and are looking forward to our next season, but as a community-oriented project we are always keen to welcome new people. Tree planting is a great way to get some fresh air and exercise over winter and though it is not strenuous, there's always enough to do to keep warm!



Artists Bev Parker, Hester Cox and Ann Rutherford are exhibiting work in Give Peat a Chance, while writers Gill Petrucci and Colin Speakman have contributed poems.

Ann Rutherford, a painter from Settle, collaborated with Sarah Smout and took inspiration from visits to Park Fell in Ingleborough and nearby Southerscales.

She said: "It's been a fantastic opportunity to really get to understand peat - all the plants, the beautiful sphagnum mosses that live on the bog and create it. It's been a journey of discovery. I was looking at these bleak moorland all open landscapes and I was curious about the detail. I played with scale, seeing as if you're an insect crawling along in that landscape. So the bog cotton is the size of trees and the dragonflies are a bit too large. I just had fun," she said.

Kevin Frea, who is Member Champion for Cultural Heritage at the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, which runs the Dales Countryside Museum, said: "The 'Give Peat a Chance' exhibition means people can see the amazing Bog in a Box. There's lots of interpretation around that. Children can come and use magnifying glasses to look at the plants in the box. It's also a chance to see artists' interpretation of peatlands, as well as Mr and Mrs Heseltine's photographs of peat cutting which won't be exhibited again as they've been loaned to us

"The serious side of this exhibition is about learning about the vital work Yorkshire Peat Partnership is doing to restore peat bogs. The sad fact is that despite the partnership's work in the past decade, most peatland in the National Park is degrading, adding carbon dioxide to the atmosphere rather than absorbing it as it Turning that situation should. around is the great conservation task of this decade in the Yorkshire Dales National Park."

The special exhibition has been supported by the <u>Esmée Fairbairn</u> <u>Foundation</u>, Friends of the Dales, Pennine PeatLIFE and the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority's Sustainable Development Fund.

The Dales Countryside Museum is open seven days a week. Tickets are £4.80 and entry to the special exhibition is included in the admission price. Children are admitted free.



Trail Riders donate to byways maintenance

An organisation promoting the responsible use of green lanes with public rights for recreational motor vehicles has made a donation to the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority.

Members of North Yorkshire Trail Riders Fellowship led by Rights of Way Officer Leo Crone presented a cheque for £2,500 to National Park Authority Area Manager Matt Neale (see picture).

The Trail Riders Fellowship (TRF) has a code of conduct for drivers recommending a maximum speed of 25mph, slowing down for walkers, stopping for horse riders, and limiting group size to help reduce the impact.

The group has made several donations to the National Park Authority during the past ten years. The money is used to maintain the surfaces of green lanes in the National Park, such as those classed as 'byways open to all traffic'.

Leo Crone from North Yorkshire TRF said: "We organise and run events throughout the year guiding riders from all over England around these beautiful areas of North Yorkshire. Within that we raise money. And the money we raise we quite often now donate to authorities who maintain the rights of way that we use.

"We would like to keep these vehicular rights of way open to the public. It's time to get our hands out of our pockets and start being part of the solution. We've been making these sorts of donations now for ten years. We don't just do it for motor vehicles but for everybody who use these routes."

Area Ranger Matt Neale, who has a team of rangers and volunteers covering the northern area of the National Park including Wensleydale and Swaledale, said: "The trail riders are aware that not everyone is a fan of recreational motor vehicles in the hills. However, for as long as they have rights to take vehicles along these green lanes and we have a duty to maintain them, then we will continue to work with all users.


