During August the team also attended a multi team underground rescue exercise in the northern Pennines.

Incident 30: 30/08/2022: Called to

assist the Ambulance and fire service with the extraction of a casualty in a difficult location. As the first team members arrived it turned out that our services weren't required.

Food waste and composting

More than 60% of the contents of an average rubbish bin is biodegradable and over a third could be composted at home according to the North Yorkshire Rotters, who came to speak to the Sustainable Swaledale Group. Peat compost to be banned for domestic use and paludiculture

The government announced on 27th August that peat-based composts will be banned for domestic use from 2024. According to government figures, bagged retail growing media accounts for 70% of the peat sold in the UK. The government is also working with horticultural firms to phase out peat-based composts in their sector. It has launched a £5 million fund to promote paludiculture (farming on rewetted peatland).

Matters Arising:

Signage - Awaiting a reply from Ian Beighton from Highways. Cllr Peacock reported that from her contacts with Ian Beighton it is likely that two signs will be fixed to the wall which Highways own, Cllr Peacock to make contact to establish progress concerning installation.

Memorial bench Occupation Lane Muker - awaiting a response from Muker commons Committee Adam Hunter

Farmers Arms - sales of premises and the road Cllr premises across Whitehead reported that the properties cannot be sold separately. It was agreed that the Premises should be registered as a Community Asset. Clerk to reaister with Richmondshire District Council.

Minutes of previous meeting:

The minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 19 May 2022, have been circulated. The minutes were approved as a correct record. Proposed by: Cllr Whitehead, Seconded by: Cllr Porter.

Finance: Nothing to report Highways:

Gutter and offsets on Crowtrees Hill.
Cllr Peacock said she had been in

contact with Highways, who think a site visit would be appropriate to establish what needs doing and whose responsibility it is. Cllr.Porter agreed that he would attend, when arranged with Steve Barker from Highways, who is currently on leave until 7th July.

Cllr Porter reported that the weak bridge sign at Ivelet Bridge is lying in the roadside. Clerk to report to Highways.

Richmondshire D.C:

Cllr. McMullen has been pursuing the defective light in Muker and a diffuser light Thwaite for one in Unfortunately, there has change in personnel with RDC and these matters seemed to have been nealected. Cllr. McMullen is now in contact with the new member of staff and will update on the situation.

NYCC:- Nothing to report

YDNPA:

Ref. R/06/37B Householder planning permission for erection of two-storey extension to rear (east elevation) of property at Frith Holme, West Stonesdale, Richmond, DL11 6EA - The Parish Council supports this application, Cllr. Peacock advised that the Parish Council should outline its reasons for supporting. In this case it is to provide extra accommodation for 3 local young children and the extension is not visible from the road and is in keeping with existing buildings. Clerk to submit comments to YDNP Planning Dept.

YLCA:

Platinum Jubilee grant funding for village halls. The Parish Council considered that there were ample funding schemes available. Cllr. Peacock pointed out that some funding may still be available up to the end of September.

Correspondence/AOB:

Tree-planting on Kisdon Side, near Keld: Cllr. Calvert reported the recent planting of trees on Kisdon Side, no consultation had taken place with the Parish Council. The concerns are:-

- a. The trees are planted in a stark grid formation, with no consideration to blending into the natural beauty of the dale.
- b. Some of the trees planted are not indigenous to the local area
- c.Planted at the wrong time of year ie. May 2022 disturbing the nesting season for birds and wildlife.

It is reported that this planting took place with the approval of the Yorkshire Dales National Park. The land in question has been purchased by someone not local to the area, who seems to have recklessly planted trees without considering the impact of their actions, namely the beauty of the dales and destruction of flora and fauna. Clerk to correspond with Mr. Rishi Sunak MP, Yorkshire Dales National Park, & DEFRA.

We are delighted to have secured the next stage in the life of the Swaledale Museum Collection. Acquired from the early 1970s, it comprises over 1,000 objects covering 300 million years of Swaledale and Arkengarthdale history, from rocks, minerals and fossils, stone leadmining age tools, equipment, knitting sticks and guilts to 1950s home-made toys. We have been looking after and growing the Collection for twenty and nearly years, responsible caretakers we are planning for its future. The recent development of Keld Resource Centre [KRC], and the acquisition of the School Room, with the intention of developing a that explores life museum Swaledale. seemed opportunity to pass the responsibility of the Collection on to a safe, professional and dedicated venue. We feel that the Collection will comfortably move from one village school to another, continuing its work educating and entertaining visitors and locals alike. Most importantly the Collection will stay in the Dale.

Though much of the Collection is moving, the Swaledale Museum is staying in Reeth. We are committed to keeping it as a place for the enjoyment, gathering and dissemination of local history. The space offers opportunities for us to develop more focused themes, to borrow objects back from the KRC

Collection, and deploy twenty years of experience working with local artefacts and archives in the investigation of related subjects. We are thinking about writing an historical guidebook to the dales, (starting with Reeth), and also pursuing collaborative research ventures. We hope to host exhibitions. workshops and school parties and groups, and develop local historical walks. Our shop will be open as usual. We will let you know how our plans shape up as we work on ideas and projects and look forward to seeing you when we re-open, as usual, in the Spring. The Friends of Swaledale Museum is supporting this development and excited about the opportunities it presents. We thank them, and all those who have sent their good wishes.

Meanwhile research into our local history continues. We were thrilled to meet Mrs Mylle West who came to the Museum last month. She is the grandniece of Mrs Bennison who donated a splendid silk and velvet patchwork quilt in 1975. We have always wanted to know more about the donor of this elegant piece of stitching made by someone who clearly had access to rather luxurious fabrics. The textiles, though expensive, are in a poor condition as the finish on the surface, used to create a glossy sheen, has eaten into the fibres. After her visit Mrs West kindly sent us a photograph of her grand-aunt Mrs Hilda May Bennison (1887-1990), who lived to 103. She was the daughter of John Dunn, who came to Battersby, on the Esk Valley line, as a Station Master, She trained as a teacher, became the

headmistress of the school Bransdale, Helmsley, and married William Bennison, solicitor а Stokesley. After becoming a widow, Mrs West notes that, 'Auntie May wanted to come back to her beloved Dales and had always loved tramping over the 'tops' with those stunning views'. To get better views 'she often moved, after a gentleman from Norman Brown's would come and take her out for a drive to look at selected properties'. In the 1950s she was in Gunnerside, but also lived for a time at Crackpot. Her tombstone in Grinton Churchyard records her as remarkable lady of the Dales'. Does anyone remember Mrs Bennison? If you do, we would love to hear from you. We think that the patchwork might have been made by Mrs Bennison's mother.

The Bothroyd (also Boothroyd or Botheroyd) clock we have had mended is now ticking happily away. It will be staying where it was made, in Reeth. The clockmender had some interesting things to say about its construction. Though the exterior and the painted spandrels are c.1840, elements of the interior including the escapements are from the 1790s. It looks as if the Bothroyds of High Row, Reeth made use of old clock parts to create contemporary fashionable pieces. James Bothroyd, who was probably responsible for this clock, is buried, Mrs Bennison. like in Grinton Churchyard. He died in 1875 aged 63, joined by his widow Ann, in 1890.



Why did miners paint the mines? For almost 200 years coal was to power The lecture, by Dr Robert McManners. nation to experience 'industrial revolution'. changed landscapes, working practices and the demography of towns, and spawned the many other heavy industries that changed society for ever.

The mines were a filthy cacophony of claustrophobic tunnels danaerous swathed in a blinding darkness, yet, desperate from these conditions



emerged many men who found beauty and majesty both

Meadow Magic

Swaledale and Arkengarthdale are rightly famous for their fabulous flower meadows. They are more than 'just' a beautiful, natural welcome to the delights of spring and early summer and a cherished keystone of traditional livestock farming practice.

Flower meadows also form much needed travel corridors for the pollinating insects that are essential to maintain both food production and biodiversity. Indeed, Swaledale has been identified as one link in a national network of insect super-highways as part of the B-Lines project that supports the government's National Pollinator Strategy for England.

The Tees-Swale: naturally connected project has started work with farmers and large landowners interested in enhancing and extending our meadowland and is also working with Sustainable Swaledale on 'Meadow Magic': aimed at helping people with small parcels of land (including gardens) learn how to introduce or improve the wildflower coverage of their immediate environment.

For the first year, six parcels of land have been identified. In each case, a soil sample has been taken and analysed (meadow flowers prefer low nutrients levels and a neutral pH). Work planned to allow volunteers to develop the necessary skills and understanding to manage the sites as meadow areas is now under way:



- A field occasionally grazed by sheep will introduce a grazing plan to allow flowers to grow, and will be treated with green hay.
- An existing paddock will be redesigned to include wildflower areas as part of a natural horsemanship scheme.
- Wildflower 'islands' will be created in a garth with a stream running through it. The islands will be scythed and then managed to see how flower species develop in different levels of moisture.
- 4. A spring grazing plan will be introduced to a juvenile meadow, aided by some liming and plug planting to expand the richness and diversity of its existing flora.
- An acidic, nutrient rich lawn area will be limed (and one section scarified), wildflower seeds introduced and then managed with a mowing programme.
- 6. A control area with the 'right' conditions will be left to itself.

An annual survey programme, conducted by volunteers trained by Tees-Swale: naturally connected, will monitor and report on progress.

It is hoped that more parcels of land will be added to the project in future years, and it will be extended to include gardens (of any size). If you would like to be involved in any way, please get in touch with Sustainable Swaledale.

Tees-Swale: naturally connected is led by North Pennines AONB and YDNPA and is supported by the National Lottery Heritage Fund.



Why creating is so good for you...

Definition Creativity: the use of imagination or original ideas to create something; inventiveness

"I came across macramé by accident in 2021 having never knitted or crocheted. My first creation was a huge wall hanging; deciding to Go Large and following an online tutorial I realised I love Macrame. Since then, I have moved onto dreamcatchers, plant hangers, crystal bearers...and now teach Wellbeing Workshops. "Ness



u3a celebrates 40 years during u3a Week 17th - 25th September

u3a used to be known as University of the Third Age but is now abbreviated to u3a, partly because the former was a little confusing. Third age tended to imply the age of participants and university suggested it was academic but it's more accurately the university of life and there isn't a strict age requirement to join.

u3a week in September was an opportunity to showcase what we do. From the start, the guiding principles have been to promote lifelong learning through self-help interest groups covering a wide range of topics and activities αs chosen by members. There is no minimum age, but a focus on people who are no longer in full-time employment or raising a family. Its founders envisaged a collaborative approach with people learning from each other rather than a teacher/pupil set up. The u3a movement was to be selffunded, with members not working towards qualifications but learning purely for pleasure. There would be no distinction between the learners and the teachers - everyone could take a turn at being both if they wished

It's all voluntary, with a low-cost annual membership, which locally is £16 and a small fee to pay for some classes or pursuits. A typical u3a like the Leyburn & District one, which formed in 2015, is home to various activity groups covering lots of different subjects. Every u3a is

unique in what is on offer as it's driven by its members. If a particular subject or topic is not yet on offer, members can put the suggestion forward or even offer to start such a group. Depending on the topic, indoor classes might take place locally at Leyburn Arts & Community Centre (LACC) or the home of a member.

Topics and interests on offer locally currently include Art Appreciation, Bell Ringing, Birds, Book Group, Cribbage, Current Affairs, DIY For Beginners, Drawing and Painting, Garden Visits, Laptops & Technology, Science, Ukulele, Walking/Rambling. Not yet A-Z but a fair try!!

In addition to this, each month an interesting talk by an invited speaker takes place and is held at the Community Centre on the third Friday of every month at 10.00am, to which visitors are always welcome. u3a is a great way to meet like minded people and to enjoy meeting socially, even just for a chat over a cuppa.


