## MOUNTAIN AND CAVE RESCUE TEAM

Incidents Sept 7th to Oct 7th: 2 Incidents this edition

On average we respond to between 50 to 60 calls each year.

It's not all mountains. While travelling back from today's training session the team came across a road crash and provided casualty care until the Ambulance service arrived.

**Incident 33:** 09/09/2022: Called by the Ambulance service to rescue a walker having a medical emergency on the fells above Healaugh. Treated on scene by the Ambulance crew and team, then evacuated by the team for onward treatment at hospital. **Incident 32**: 07/09/2022: Called to assist the Ambulance with a collapsed member of a shooting party. Unfortunately, the casualty was pronounced dead at the scene & was evacuated by the team.

#### Memories of Holidays in Swaledale

John Rainbow has sent in some memories, sparked by a conversation with Raymond Alderson whilst walking above Low Row:

My mother, Pat, was evacuated to Swaledale in WWII. My grandfather's family then bought properties in Low Row: my grandfather, Bert, first acquired Mud House in the 60s and then Isles Cottage in the early 70s. His brother, Frank, bought Laykin about the same time. The family name was Stabler. Isles Cottage remained in the family until the 90s. I was born in 1962 and I spent most of my holidays in Swaledale as a child. I remember the milk wagon collecting milk churns and playing in the Swale and jumping on the bank making sand martins fly out of their 'burrows'. We collected milk

from Hazel Brow with tin foil tops and could get a guarter of sweets from the old post office. When visiting Reeth, I would often get an Airfix model from the Gift Shop and on Sundays we would collect the papers from the bus shelter and leave the money in a pot. Often, we would be surprised by low flying Vulcan bombers in the valley and the noise! Every Easter our family would book Sunday lunch at The Buck in the round room. Swaledale has always held a special place in my heart and when the opportunity arose to get a static caravan in Reeth we jumped at the chance. I am now trying to pass on my knowledge and love of the area to our children and grandchildren.

#### Planning for a new Richmondshire health and care campus gets the go-ahead

Formal planning approval has been granted for the new Catterick Integrated Care Campus, bringing construction of a brand-new health and care facility for Richmondshire a step closer.

More than seven years in development, venture between this joint the National Health Service (NHS) and Ministry of Defence (MOD) will provide a range of healthcare services for Armed Forces personnel and their families based at Catterick Garrison residents of the wider and Richmondshire area.

Subject to final clinical modelling, the purpose-build centre on the Garrison will feature primary care, advanced primary care, mental health services, physiotherapy, NHS dentistry for children and adults with a disability and voluntary and community healthcare support providers under one roof.

It is hoped the new Integrated Care Campus will be completed in 2024.

Wendy Balmain, North Yorkshire Place Director for the NHS Humber and



North Yorkshire Integrated Care Board (HNYICB) said:

"The NHS and MOD have been working together since 2015 to turn the vision for an integrated health and care campus for military and local civilian populations into reality. The formal planning approval is a major milestone, moving us forward with finalising our service proposals and achieving final approvals. I would like to thank all our partners for this significant collective achievement that in time will support the needs of the local community."

Karina Dare, Regional Partnership Director for North East and Yorkshire NHS Property Services, said: at "Passing this important planning milestone is a fantastic achievement and I want to congratulate the clinical teams as well as the technical team for their time and commitment to reach this stage. We will continue to support our NHS colleagues as we move into the next approvals stage with the ultimate aim of supporting delivery of vital services to the local community."

Air Commodore Luke Houghton KHP MStJ - Head Healthcare Plans, Headquarters Defence Medical Services for the MOD said:

"We are absolutely delighted to be informed of Richmondshire District Council's formal planning approval of the Catterick Integrated Care Campus design. This decision paves the way for an exciting future healthcare facility and delivery model for both the NHS and MOD. It is an opportunity to collaborate and work together and to focus on the health needs of the whole population in the area through excellence in joint clinical practice and learning."

Elected representatives across Richmondshire said the campus would bring healthcare provision closer for many residents of the vast and largely rural district as well as increasing access to NHS services near to some of North Yorkshire's most deprived communities.

Councillor Angie Dale, Leader of Richmondshire District Council, said the integrated care campus is a muchneeded facility for the district. Ϊ" welcome this development which will complement our vision for Catterick Garrison - it links with the work we are doing on the regeneration of the town centre which is subject to a £19m bid levelling from central ub government."

Throughout the project, appointed contractor, Tilbury Douglas's aim is to maximise social value for the area, with a focus on new job creation and training opportunities for the local community. They will also engage with local community groups to identify ways in which they can provide support. plans to hold future There are engagement events together with partners for the local community, which will be advertised locally.

Paul Ellenor, Regional Director of Tilbury Douglas Construction said:

"It's fantastic to have received formal planning permission for the Integrated Care Campus. My team and the project's design partners have worked hard to develop a scheme that the local community can be proud of. Construction of the new Integrated Care Campus will benefit the local area, both during construction through new employment and training opportunities, and for the life of the building,

supporting the community with high quality health care services. My team will now focus on finalising the design and preparing the site for construction to commence early next year."

Works have already commenced on site to prepare it for the start of construction in Spring 2023. Several previously unused and dilapidated buildings have now been demolished due to being no longer viable for use.

Baden Powell House, a building with significant history for the local community and MOD will be retained on the site, and following completion of the new health campus, will be refurbished, and remain in use.

#### The Closure of the 2 Dales Luncheon Clubs Association

Unfortunately the decision has been taken to close the Swaledale and Arkengarthdale Luncheon Clubs Association. This follows a unanimous vote by members at an Extraordinary General Meeting after it had proved impossible to find a replacement caterer.

The first Lunch Club was set up in Langthwaite in 1994 and was an immediate success. Further clubs were set up in Muker and Low Row in 1995. and another club was then started in Reeth in 1999. The four clubs were arranged so that they met on a different week. and once each month. The original aim of the Lunch Clubs was to "encourage social interaction and to foster well being throughout the community by enabling residents to meet together socially whilst enjoying nutritious sustenance", and, while this may sound a bit antiquated by today's standards, I think that the Clubs succeeded in this aim, and proved to be a valuable asset - particularly to the older members of the community.

The Constitution specifies that if it is necessary to dissolve the Association then any cash assets shall be donated equally to the community facilities (Village Halls) that were used to host the Lunch Clubs. However, it was pointed out that the Langthwaite Club had met in both the Congregational School Room and the Community Sports Club in recent years, and so an amendment was tabled to split the Langthwaite share of the funds equally between the two venues and this was also agreed unanimously.

So after 28 years the committee would like to thank everyone that has supported the Lunch Clubs, especially our sponsors, our caterers and our volunteers past and present. Thank you one and all.

August we were tasked with being on standby at various stations, helping to keep resources spread out when North Yorkshire, alongside the rest of the country, was experiencing the heatwave. We were requested by the police to provide medical assistance to a casualty as the ambulance service were under extreme pressures and were not going to arrive for some time.

We had another assistance message from the Yorkshire air ambulance to open a large metal gate which we did with the crew using the hydraulic spreaders and rams and then assisting the air ambulance with extracting the casualty to the helicopter.

A car fire in Wensleydale saw Reeth and a crew from Leyburn team up to deal on a hot job after a fuel tank ruptured and generated some serious heat.

Hopefully a few of you saw us down at Reeth Show. We had a great day meeting lots of people of all ages discussing what we do and how you can help keep yourself and others safe.



#### <u>Candles</u>

As a fire service, we still attend fires that have started from the use of candles and there has been a growing concern particularly around Halloween after an incident hit the headlines where a young person's costume was ignited after getting too close to a candle.

- Never Place Candles or tealights directly on plastic services

- They look nice in a window but never put them next to curtains or blinds

- Avoid putting them where they might get knocked over or where children and pets could get close to them

- Never leave candles burning, have a check around your home before you go to bed or leave the house

- ensure you have working smoke alarms installed on every level of your house and in rooms that are most regularly inhabited

If you can, look at battery operated candles. There are some very realistic products available made of wax that randomly flicker and also come with timers or operate via a remote. Batteries will last up to 6 months as they run an LED so they also end up cheaper in the long run than real candles. Search online for Lights4fun truglow battery candles





#### Farewell to Muker Boy Band

The 15<sup>th</sup> October marked the end of an era in modern popular music. Back in February 2015 the Muker Boy Band played their first gig at the Farmer's Arms in Muker. Seven years and fourteen shows later the band played their final gig at the world famous Muker Public Hall.



Following a drink fuelled evening together way back, dancing to Take That, three budding Swaledale based musicians had the sudden revelation that the world needed yet another Boy Band. So, following a path previously trodden by The Jacksons, The Monkees, Bay City Rollers and Boyzone, they formed a band!

The original, and perhaps classic, Muker Boy Band line up consisted of Andrew Green (guitar, bass guitar, melodeum, violin, harmonica, banjo, tin whistle and bass voice), Martin Dower (guitar, ukulele and tenor voice) & John Slater (kazoo and falsetto). Free from the temptations of fame and fortune, ignoring popular trends and styles, and never troubling the hit parade, they blazed their own trail, playing an eclectic set of music stolen from some of the world's most famous protest song writers: Dylan, Bragg, Cohen and Jonathan King, to name but few.

The early years were not without their troubles. Though they usually began songs together they often ended them apart. After one problematic practice, when Martin finished Dylan's Mr Tambourine Man 5 minutes after John and Andrew had gone home, David Braithwaite was brought into the band to provide a solution in the form of a dedicated drum and bass section. However, difficulties in playing both drum and bass at the same time ultimately led to his sudden departure and a period of convalescence in Norfolk\*.

Notoriously thrifty, so unwilling to invest in a metronome, the band turned to the cheaper option of contracting Muker's premier bongo player, Richard Walls. Though this didn't solved the problem, Richard's contract writing skills meant that they were legally obliged to involve him as a percussionist in 75.5% of all songs played.

Famously the band operated a democratic, rules-based system with no leader or chief songwriter. All primary band members were obliged to sing an equal number of songs at gigs, the order of songs sung was based on a strict rotational system - either clockwise or counter-clockwise, and the second set always began with a light-hearted ditty choreographed in a mildly amusing way! They were all too aware that any breach of their rulesbased system would cause discord and dissent in the audience, a lesson that today's world leaders should reflect onl

#### 'Mmmm so creamy!' Reeth Cheesemaker in The Dales Cheese Festival

An artisan cheesemaker channelled the spirit of medieval monks for the Yorkshire Dales Cheese Festival 2022 in October.

Simon Lacey from Reeth in Swaledale has created a new traditional Wensleydale Cheese using raw sheep's milk supplied by High Carlingill Farm in the Westmorland Dales.

Mr Lacey, who began making his St Benedict's and Fallen Monk sheep's milk Wensleydales five months ago, said: "I am massively passionate about the product and its provenance. It's about trying to get a product that is a natural as it can be, that's why the milk isn't homogenised or heat treated.

"Wensleydale was originally a French recipe made at Fors and Jervaulx abbeys. It was sheep's milk, and it was raw milk. It's a softer, buttery, more open textured cheese than people have become used to. And it's not too pungent or strong; it's a cheese that you could eat for breakfast, lunch or dinner."

Mr Lacey established Lacey's Cheese around 15 years ago and operates from one of the light industry units at Reeth Dales Centre. As well as making cheese and ice cream, he runs popular one-day cheese making courses teaching nearly 500 people a year. He said the Cheese Festival had been a way of showcasing the talent in the Dales.

"Physically it's incredibly demanding to make ewe's milk cheese and then look after it for four months. You feel alone up here sometimes, but cheese makers and milk producers chat and we



feel like a little community. You feel part of something, a collective."

The sheep's milk is sourced from within the National Park at High Carlingill Farm and delivered by David Knipe, a farmer from Tebay who describes himself as a 'Westmorian' having lived all his life in the Westmorland Dales.

Mr Knipe said: "You go back to prefoot and mouth [in 2001] and in Cumbria there was one or two cheese producers, that's all there was. Now we've got more than a dozen artisan makers. It's a growth industry. There are no two cheeses the same, that's the beauty of it. It's texture that gives taste. You want something in



your mouth that gives you a buzz."

Member Champion for Promoting Understanding at the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, Kevin Frea, said: "We are seeing a resurgence of artisan cheese making and other dairy products in the Dales, supported by a network of local shops and farmers' markets It's a movement we were excited to support through the Yorkshire Dales Cheese Festival. Α cheese-induced 'buzz' - as Farmer David put it - would be a great description of what festival goers experienced."

We are delighted that the transfer of the Swaledale Museum Collection is now complete, and the objects are now safely in the capable hands of Helen Guy at Keld Resource Centre. Thanks to everyone involved who made this all possible: you know who you are. The Museum is now closed until Spring 2023 when we re-open. Meanwhile we are now busy redecorating and reconfiguring the Museum. So many stories to tell, it is difficult to decide which to choose.

We continue to act as a port of entry for historical material relating to Swaledale and Arkengarthdale. The most recent gift is a document from family history researcher Andrea Aven from Edmond, Oklahoma, USA. In it Mr William Pounder of Ivelet, [Mary farmer and others Ann Swinbank, George Wharton of Satron, Miner and Hannah his wife, Jane Swinbank of Satron spinster, John Lowes and Alice his wife] give Mr James Wallis the Power of Attorney 'to act in the administration and distribution of the estate of [their aunt] Hannah Pratt , [late of Dubuque, Iowa, USA] deceased dated 3 May 1880'. It reveals how Dales people managed to negotiate the distance between their new and old homes, maintaining family connections. Andrea wanted to make it available to others, as she gained so much from it herself. So, we are posting scans of the full

document and the transcription, all kindly provided by the donor to whom we are greatly indebted, on our website - see Research and Explore section.

### Former pupil to lead Dales Dance School

Veteran dance teacher Janet Seymour has passed the running of her muchloved Dales dance school to former pupil and qualified dance teacher, Hannah Smith.

The Janet Seymour School of Theatre Dance will now be called the Dales Dance School of Performing Arts.

Janet Seymour began teaching dance in the Dales in 2004 to six children from Reeth as a volunteer. She has since built a thriving school offering ballet, tap, modern and jazz dance lessons at ten different venues in Swaledale and Wensleydale. More than two-hundred girls and boys aged from three to eighteen are currently on the school roll.



Hannah Smith learnt ballet, tap and modern with Janet till she was eighteen. After training in London, Hannah taught dance and musical theatre at Victoria Walker School in

Ireland. In 2020 she returned to her home in the Dales to work with Janet as an assistant teacher, meaning that she knows many of her pupils already.

Hannah said: 'Janet must have taught over one-thousand children in the Dales, and I was lucky enough to be one of them. My first dance lesson with Janet was a tap class. She said to me 'can you do a shuffle hop step', and I could, so I was put in a slightly higher class. Thanks to Janet, I spent my youth dancing, performing, and living and breathing the arts, despite living in a deeply rural area. I don't have to think about smiling when I perform that is my emotion. I'm so thrilled to be taking on the dance school and sharing that love with others.'

Janet said: 'It makes me so happy to know I am handing my school over to my former pupil and very talented colleague, Hannah. I know the school will go from strength to strength. Hannah has already won the students over with her caring nature. From our youngest to our more mature students, Hannah motivates and encourages with her warm, creative classes.'

Although the leadership role will lie with Hannah, Janet has no plans to retire and will continue to teach classes under the school's new name. 'We are a team,' says Hannah, 'we are swapping places, but it's wonderful to have the continuity.'

The passing of the baton was celebrated at a picnic event in the picturesque grounds of Askrigg School in July, where an audience of one-



hundred and fifty gathered to watch a performance of The Wizard of Oz and a showcase of dance sequences from pupils across Wensleydale and Swaledale.

As well as offering weekly lessons and opportunities to progress through the exam system with the Royal Academy of Dance, Janet Seymour has put children on the stage at venues such as Georgian Theatre Royal in Richmond and Tennants in Leyburn, organised concerts at local festivals and care homes, arranged international dancebased exchanges between the Dales and Germany, taught summer schools, choregraphed pantomimes and run inspirational classes for adults.

Janet said: 'The dance school actually grew during lockdown. Hannah and I started teaching on Zoom at 8am and were still going twelve hours later. For some pupils the lessons were the only normality they had. Dance gives you joy and love for the arts, but it also gives you coping strategies. It helps mental health and gets you through the difficult times in life. It enables you to enter into a world of fantasy and imagination.

The Dales Dance School of Performing Arts launched on 12<sup>th</sup> September. It provides expert dance tuition across Swaledale and Wensleydale to children from three years and adults, and specialises in teaching RAD Ballet, ISTD Tap and Jazz, Musical Theatre and Jazz Fit. ### The Arts Society Wensleydale presents "Edward Burne-Jones: Painting Angels"



### Reeth Filling Station Update

We thought the community might welcome an update on Reeth Garage forecourt.

Hudson House's investigation work in preparation for a possible community purchase of the filling station was completed earlier this summer. We now have a great deal of information on the site and the significant work that needs to be done to make it viable as a filling station. This information includes surveys of the storage tanks, petrol spill interceptor, drainage and buildings.

Hudson House also commissioned work on possible site layout, regulatory requirements, equipment and 24/7 operations. The project team also held discussions with potential petrol suppliers, site operators and with Northern Powergrid on the feasibility of installing fast electric chargers. We are very grateful to Richmondshire District Council for a generous grant which reimbursed most of the costs and made this work possible.

Our conclusion was that a community filling station could be viable, provided the purchase price recognised the amount of work required to update the pumps and buildings. Based on those figures we have made an appropriate offer, but the owner is currently testing the market at a price we cannot make work and therefore cannot recommend to the community. In the event that other offers do

come in, that isn't necessarily bad news. It all depends on what the purchaser wants to do with the site. Hudson House's overriding objective is to get fuel supplies back in the two dales, and while we would like there to be some community involvement we will work constructively with anyone who can help deliver that.

Meanwhile I'd like to express my thanks to the project team who have put a lot of work into this. They are all volunteers, giving their time and expertise for free in the best tradition of the Dales.
