Vacancy for Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer

Reeth. Freminaton and Healaugh Parish Council highly seeks α motivated, enthusiastic person to take on the post of Clerk to the Council and Responsible Financial Officer. The council manages the parish land in the three villages, including the village greens in Reeth and Healaugh and the play area in Reeth. It organises annual events such as the Remembrance Day Parade in November and Carols Around the Tree in December

The ideal candidate will have local authority experience; however, this is not a prerequisite of the role, which requires accuracy, an attention to detail and a willingness to learn.

Prior relevant experience is an advantage but training in all aspects of local government administration, leading to the Certificate in Local Council Administration (CiLCA) qualification is available.

The post is part time, averaging 35 hours per calendar month. Working mainly from home, the hours of work are flexible except for attendance at parish council meetings. These are held approximately 10 times per year and are generally held on the fourth Monday of every month (except August and December when there are no meetings). Normally these are held at Reeth Memorial Hall at 7pm.

The salary is £5,128.20 per annum, paid monthly across 12 months.

The successful applicant will have good communication, administrative

and numeracy skills and will be able to use computer spreadsheets, email, the internet and Office software. They will be able to work on their own initiative. Computer equipment is supplied. The successful candidate must be able to store Council equipment and files at their own home address in accordance with GDPR regulations.

The work entails acting as advisor to the council which involves learning the relevant parish legislation, dealing with correspondence, arranging Parish Council meetings, attending, taking minutes for these meeting and helping to administer the functions of the council. This involves liaising with councillors, external bodies, and the public. Other responsibilities include preparina council policies procedures. and providing administrative support for the maintenance of areas within the parish that the council is responsible for, such as the play area and the greens, and liaising with the district and county councils on matters such as street lighting and highways.

In addition, the Clerk will also be the Responsible Financial Officer to the council and is required to manage the council's income and expenditure, tax returns and annual audit.

John Woo film with all his idiosyncrasies), but the last four (all helmed by McQuarrie) have raised the bar for the 'action blockbuster'.

TOM CRUISE

We'll not consider plot details here - if you're still reading, you've either seen it or will be doing so soon! Suffice to say it's the second part of 'Final Reckoning' (all films reviewed in this column previously) with matters of the cruciform key, sunken sub and ubervillain 'Gabriel' to tie up. Some critics have noted a weaker first 'act' and the film's tendency to stress Cruise's almost messianic role in saving the Earth - but I would disagree as we also see how plot elements from all previous films have led to this current predicament - in effect much of the

problem has been created by all that bravery and self-sacrifice - it's an interesting concept. The film is also over 2 ½ hours long. nonetheless absorbing and entertaining throughout.

There's action aplenty, even before the credits roll (about 20 minutes in?) including a bone crunching fight which the film makers wisely conclude with just the facial reactions of Hayley Atwell as Tom takes out several more

> goons. We only the alimpse aftermath (involving cleavers and meat tenderisers) of several one darkly humorous which moments lift the almost unbearable

tension at times.

Tension a-plenty comes in the middle act extended sequence where Tom (eventually just in his shorts) retrieves the 'device' from the sunken Russian sub as it slowly rolls along the seabed towards a bottomless chasm - classic MI - and we still have time for a brief sojourn with DJs and posh dresses and of course lots of sweating US military generals in the biggest 'bunker' ever as the world nears annihilation (plaudits to Angela Bassett for portraying a convincing US president could we vote for her please?)

Simon Peaa. Vina Rhames and Miss Atwell return, as does 'Kitteridge' (the guy chasing Tom in Movie#1) and also that Langley techie from the original who almost catches Tom retrieving the

'nok' utilising his wire 'rig'. remember? (Luckily for us, he's kept Tom's knife for the last twenty years). Final mention however to the awesome stunt work in the last act - it's hard to believe that it's actually our Tom hanging from that biplane whilst it loops, but plenty of close ups (brilliant cinematography throughout by the way) leave you in no doubt and this whole sequence is as good as cinema gets. Lalo Schiffrin's original theme is heard throughout, and the only thing missing is seeing someone lighting that fuse again!



Muker Parish Council Minutes of Parish Meeting Held March 2025

Present: Cllr Metcalfe, Cllr Porter, Cllr Reynoldson, Cllr Rukin and Cllr Calvert Chair presiding.

Clerk: Mr Michael Cleminson.

Apologies for Absence: Cllr Peacock.

Matters Arising:

Swaledale Housing Needs. presentation was given John Matthews of the Upper Dales Community Land Trust (UDCLT) and Amanda Madden of the Rural Housing Enablers, part of North Yorkshire Council (NYC). The UDCLT is a small charity set up in 2017 by Cllr Stephen Stubbs of Arkengarthdale PC and the late Cllr John Blackie to identify land and old buildings for Affordable Housing (AH) in the Dales. A project has been completed in Bainbridge, the emphasis on providing housing for local occupancy, using other agencies to manage tenants. Agencies including NYC have provided funding to complete projects, where possible using local builders. The UDCLT works closely with Cllr Peacock, NYC and The Yorkshire Dales National Parks Authority (YDNPA). The Council's support is sought so that a survey by letter to residents of the Parish takes place between 5 and 30 May 2025, to assess housina needs. Post survev requirement to identify suitable land or old buildings next to existing settlements for the development of AH, providing the survey establishes the need for AH. A criteria is set to provide assistance with a percentage reduction for purchase or rent subject to individuals' circumstances. The Council unanimously supports the distribution of the Housing Needs Survey to Parish residents to commence in May 2025. The Chair thanked both parties for attending and giving their presentation.

b. Public toilets at Keld and Muker. NYC have been reviewing all public toilets in the County to assess their continued viability and to set a minimum standard by 2035. A criteria of 12,775 uses per year or 35 per day is considered a minimum requirement. At present the uses of the toilets in Muker and Keld are classed as low. The review is not completed yet. There is potential that the toilets may close permanently. Other options include the Parish Council assuming control and maintenance of them, or paying NYC to maintain them for the Parish Council or using Community Volunteers to maintain them. The Councils considers that the cost of maintainina the toilets includina maintenance of the buildings would be too costly without a substantial increase in the precept which was not considered a viable option. Councillors have also noticed the practice of propping doors open so that no payment is made. This practice is in effect reducing revenue which may lead to the closure of the toilets: this practice is to be discouraged. The review is ongoing with no decision being made at this time. Cleaning in the high season is 5 times per week and 3 x per week in the low season. Cllrs were of the opinion that the toilets do not require cleaning as frequently, particularly in winter, which would allow NYC to reduce their costs.

Funding for the £70,000 project has come from North Yorkshire Council the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust and the Wensleydale and Swaledale Quaker Trust, as well as other funders, the Centre's own funds and numerous donations from the public. The shed was officially opened by Chris Ellison, who was the first person to donate to the appeal. She gave the money in memory of her late father Alan, a former metal and woodwork teacher who lived in Leyburn, also donating his tools to the shed.

Julian Pinches, project manager and a trustee of the Arts and Community Centre, thanked the organisations, businesses and members of the community who had supported the scheme.

He said: "£70,000 is quite a lot of money, but when you see what we have achieved with that money, I think you'll agree it's a bargain. There have been huge challenges to get where we are. None of us had any experience of doing this before but we've done it" He

added: "We've now got 40 members and an even split of men and women, which we're delighted about." Many local firms & businesses have also supported the





Visit by Richmond & Northallerton MP: The RT Hon Rishi Sunak

Our local MP visited the Reeth Surgery on 23rd May to find out more about projects run by Sustainable Swaledale (below). We talked to him about our Together for Trees hedge and tree planting project, and our WingIt project supporting swallows, swifts and martins. He also had a chance to tour our two projects based at the Reeth Surgery: the community veg beds and the tree nursery creche.

Set up with a grant from the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority Sustainable Development Fund, the veg



beds have been operating since June 2020. Rishi encountered Lovage for the first time and was very impressed with how productive the beds looked. including those looked after by Reeth and Gunnerside school children. The second project he viewed was the tree nursery creche, set up two years ago with support from the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust. After hearing about the project's aims, and viewing saplings raised from local seed and ready to be planted out this winter (as part of the Together for Trees project); Rishi potted on four bird cherries, grown from seeds collected last autumn. These seedlings will now stay in their root trainers, prior to planting out in winter 2026

We are grateful to Reeth Surgery and Marie and Mike Brookes for their ongoing permission to use the land around the surgery; to the project funders; and to all the volunteers who have helped to keep the projects running.

Fishing society volunteers help to restore Skeeby Beck

Volunteers from Richmond and District Angling Society joined forces with Yorkshire Dales Rivers Trust (YDRT) staff in a hands-on restoration event Skeeby Beck recently. collaborative project is part of a broader programme to enhance the health of Skeeby Beck, a watercourse still recovering from a major pollution incident in 2023. The concentrated on the translocation of Ranunculus, a native aquatic plant known for its wide-ranging benefits. As YDRT volunteer coordinator Jennifer Lee explained: "It improves water flow, oxygenates the water and provides essential habitat for insects and juvenile fish. What's amazing is that once it's replanted, it just looks like it's always been there."

Rather than return it to the National Grid, the scheme will see the newly-installed panels divert excess energy to the local community, including nearby homes and businesses. Reverend Gordon Hay, of Gracious Street Methodist Church (where the panels were installed), said: "The idea that we could share some of that energy with our neighbours - people who live or work just around the corner - feels like exactly what a church should be doing."

James's programme for us is particularly

personal to Aysgarth featuring a number of works by George Butterworth, sadly lost at the Battle of the Somme in 1916. His connection with Aysgarth dates from his school days at Aysgarth School (originally based almost next to St. Andrew's Church, and later at Newton-le-Willows near Bedale). Butterworth composed truly beautiful music including many songs. Included in the programme are his settings of the poems of A. E. Housman "A Shropshire Lad" and James's first performance of "Love blows as the Wind Blows" from poems by W. E. Henley. Other composers featured are the ever popular Vaughan-Williams, Ivor Gurney (another poet and composer of the First World War who survived the war but suffered from the after effects for the rest of his life) and John Ireland's settings of two poems by Rupert Brooke.

The team is made up of highly trained volunteers available, 24/7 in any weather, any time of the day or night.

MOUNTAIN & CAVE RESCUE TEAM

On average we respond to between 40 and 50 calls each year.

In 2024 we attended 53 incidents.

7 Incidents this edition

A rather busy period for the team with 7 incidents dealt with, ranging from searches on land and water to serious trauma & multi agency working.

Incident 19: 08/06/2025: Called by the Police at 03.30 to search for a missing high-risk teenager in the Catterick area. Located later by the Police safe.

Incident 18: 31/05/2025: Called by the Ambulance Service as part of a multi-agency rescue of a person in the water at Richmond Falls. Team on scene in 9 minutes. Working alongside North Yorkshire Police, Richmond Fire Station and the Yorkshire Air Ambulance.

Incident 17: 30/05/2025: Called by the Police following reports of clothing, including walking boots, found near Kisdon waterfall at Keld. Given last night's high river levels a search of the riverbank and immediate water was conducted. Nothing found the team stood down.

Incident 16: 25/05/2025: Called in the early hours to assist a couple of experienced campers struggling with the bank holiday storm blowing through! Their tent was taking a fair pounding, so we assisted them from the Pennine / Herriot Way below Great Shunner Fell to Hardraw.

Incident 15: 20/05/2025: Called by the Ambulance to work alongside the Police, Richmond and Reeth Fire crews and the Air Ambulance. This time to rescue a person following a vehicle accident high on the fells above West Burton. A great example of multiagency working.

Incident 14: 19/05/2025: Called by the Ambulance Service to assist with the rescue of a person following a fall from the Swale Bridge. Treated on scene by the Ambulance and team medics and assisted by the Police. Evacuated by stretcher to the road Ambulance

Incident 13: 17/05/2025: Called by the Ambulance Service to rescue an injured walker near Richmond Falls. Treated on scene by the Ambulance crew and team members. Then carried along the path to the road Ambulance.

Incident 12: 14/05/2025: Called by the Ambulance to rescue an injured walker following a fall down a steep embankment. Treated on scene and evacuated to the ambulance.




