Save Grinton Youth Hostel!

Some of you may have seen that Grinton Youth Hostel has gone on the market for £950,000. Built in 1817 as a shooting lodge it later became the property of the Charlesworth family. Followina the death of Charlesworth, and subsequent family tragedies, his widow sold the property, along with the five acres in which it sits, to the Youth Hostel Association (YHA) in 1948, and it has been a youth hostel ever since. In 2000 funding was



provided by the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust. Millennium Commission the European Regional

Development Fund and YHA to develop accommodation. facilities and Described on the Yorkshire Dales of National Park's 'Out Oblivion' website as 'a bit like a castle' ,and a 'magnificent buildina' with spectacular views over Swaledale and easy access by public transport it is surely a gem in the YHA's crown?

The Saint by John Hunter

Spoiler alert! - This month's offering contains unabashed nostalgia, and comes courtesy of our namesake TV channel, who regularly air 'The Saint'. Catching the end of an episode recently in which the debonair Mr Templar was in Belgrade - or not reminded me of the advertising campaign for the series when first issued on VHS in the

mid '80s. Probably lifted from the original 1960s 'industry' promos, and featuring the dulcet tones of the great Patrick Allen remember distinctly "...THE series exotic for locales...

accompanying lots of 'stock' footage of the aforementioned locations, occasionally with a poorly 'matted' in Roger Moore in the foreground. We all realise of course that the cast rarely if ever left the safe confines of Elstree studios in Hertfordshire—where such movies as 'Moby Dick' and 'The Dambusters' (utilising the famous 'tank') were shot in the 50's when many top Hollywood actors worked there. Later, '2001', 'The Shining' and 'Star Wars' were also made there.

Observant 'spotters' will recognise the same 'street corner' set appearing throughout the run - if we're 'in' Paris, the shop front will be a boulangerie, if in Hamburg, there will be wursts on

display - and so on. Add in a few 'foreign' cars (we didn't see many in the early 60's in the UK) and most of us were fooled! Any 'factory' / 'weapons plant' featured were simply the white 'studio' buildings at Elstree, and the between them (great roads 'checkpoint' scenes with the 'Halt' sign being replaced with 'Anhalten' 'Detenerse') - you get the picture!. Even in big budget movies the same ploys were used - note in the 'Goldfinger' car (when the DB5 shows us its chase tricks before being totalled) - those

narrow alleys between the buildings of Goldfinger's smelting factory are actually in Pinewood studios just north of London, not Switzerland

I admit to being a 'Saint' fan as a growing boy - full marks to Roger Moore

for fleshing out the character created by author Leslie Charteris. I never really liked Moore's 007, but he certainly nailed Simon Templar - he could shoot straight, drive fast, woo the ladies, and there were even some pretty good fisticuff scenes (for its day). The show aired between 1962 and 1969, following from the successful 'Danger Man' (also extending the running time) and was initially produced by Monty Berman, who later created the popular 'Champions' for Lew Grade's ITC. Of course this involved more of a 'sci-fi' premise, though the later 'Saint' episodes followed a rather more 'fantasy' path, if never delving into fullon 'Avengers' territory (remember the one where Templar dresses as



Centurion to 'investigate' a 'Roman' cult, complete with sword fights and a live tiger in the 'cellar'?).

Did you know - although not appearing, Moore's voice is heard on the car radio in Val Kilmer's poorly received 'Saint' movie (1997)- and Moore actually addressed the audience directly in the original series' pre-credits sequence, later on just looking up at his 'halo'.

Muker Parish Council Minutes of Parish Meeting Held May 2025

Present: Cllr Metcalfe, Cllr Porter, Cllr Reynoldson, Cllr Rukin and Cllr Calvert - Chair presiding and later Cllr Peacock

Clerk: Mr Michael Cleminson. Apologies for Absence: None

Declaration of Interests: The Chair, Cllr Calvert declared an interest in the extension and the height of the mobile telephone mast, as owner of the land. Cllr Reynoldson declared an interest in a planning application in Thwaite which adjoins his property.

Matters Arising:

a. NYC School Proposals. Cllr Calvert attended the protest held at County Hall, Northallerton on Wednesday 21st May 2025, he also was present in the public gallery during the debate in the Extraordinary meeting to review the NYC school proposal. He said that many positive comments were made by councillors who did not support the proposal. The Chair and member of the gallery considered that Cllr. Gareth Dadd did not treat them with respect, pointing his finger at the Liberal Democrat Councillors and the Public Gallery. He later again addressed the meeting clarifying that directed his comments were Councillors and not the Public Gallery. The Parish Council consider Cllr Dadd's comments to be disrespectful and that he should have apologised to the people in the Public Gallery, Councillors agreed that a formal complaint be made to NYC about his conduct. Disappointingly. despite the eloquent statements to

reverse the proposal, the proposal was voted through again, by 45 votes to 35 with 4 abstentions. The Parish Council were also disappointed in the lack of support and action by MP Rishi Sunak and the Conservative Party. The Parish Council believes that rural communities are being victimised by additional costs to transport their children to school, will dissuade families from relocating or remaining in the Upper Dales, impacting on the diversity and demographics of the community and potentially reducing or removing future generations to the Dales. The Parish Council believes that the Conservative Party is not representing and supporting the unique Upper Dales community, and that we are significantly disadvantaged when compared to urban communities. The Schools Transport Action Group (STAG) is currently considering their options to further challenge ridiculous proposal which introduced in September 2025. Parish Council wishes to commend STAG for their excellent work over the past year. The Parish Council is also aware of potential changes to Gunnerside and Reeth Schools, as NYC are of the opinion that the current set-up does not comply with current legislation. There potentially some ramifications should the two schools be impacting yet again on the education and well-being of our children. Cllr Peacock said she opposes this proposal to split the two schools and is actually working with the schools and NYC to find a solution to retain the current arrangement. This is much appreciated by the Parish Council. The Parish Council still does not understand following the Freedom Information requests, NYC can make a

Luxury Glamping Pods Join Yorkshire Dales Cycling Hotspot

Thanks to Allica Bank Backing

A much-loved Yorkshire Dales cycling hub has embarked upon a major new chapter with the addition of luxury glamping pods, thanks to financial support from Allica Bank - a challenger bank for established businesses.

Dales Bike Centre, based in Fremington, near Reeth, is already a go-to destination for cyclists, walkers and cake-lovers alike from across the region and beyond. Now, with new plans in place, the family-run business is now offering stylish glamping accommodation alongside its popular ride, eat and stay experience.

Owned and run by husband-and-wife team Stu and Brenda Price, Dales Bike Centre has been part of the Swaledale community since 2009. The couple's vision - to create a welcoming, sustainable base for cyclists to enjoy the beauty of the Dales - has grown into a thriving local hub with a strong reputation across Yorkshire and the entire UK.

Visitors to Dales Bike Centre can hire a range of bikes, from children's options to high-spec e-bikes, download GPX routes, or join guided rides led by the centre's experienced team. The on-site workshop is a trusted service point for many local riders and visiting cyclists, and is an authorised dealer for both Orange Bikes and Trek.

The Cakery Café is well-loved for its homemade cakes, breakfasts and lunches, with ingredients sourced locally where possible. Since its 2022 extension, it's also become a space for community events and



regular meet-ups, with a large outdoor area for visitors to enjoy in warmer months.

Dales Bike Centre employs staff from around ten local families, many of whom have been with the business since its early days. The Prices have prioritised sustainability from the start, repurposing original buildings and working with local suppliers for everything from food to building materials.

Accommodation includes the Cakery Loft – a self-contained unit sleeping four – and group-friendly bunk rooms, with secure bike storage. With planning restrictions limiting previous expansion ideas, and a growing demand for more premium stays, the new glamping pods mark an exciting step forward.

Opened at the start of July, the glamping pods provide guests with a comfy king-size bed, en-suite shower room, kitchen area and private seating space – all nestled in the idyllic Yorkshire countryside. They're a frills-included

Archaeology project uncovers Ingleborough's hidden past

Findings from recent cave excavations on Inaleborough have revealed new insights into the people and animals that once roamed the Yorkshire Dales, including the remains of a Bronze Age Auroch, thought to be the wild ancestor of modern cattle. Project officer Claire Braeburn said: "Ingleborough has a longstanding history as common land, so we wanted to see if the caves held evidence of just how long ago humans began farming on the fell.

"Over half of England was common land, but now it's just 3%. This project has helped us understand more about human interaction with the common and the land's longstanding biodiversity. It has shown how important preserving these ancient practices is or we risk losing them forever."

The Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority's Member Champion for Cultural Heritage, David Noland said: "Projects like this not only deepen our understanding of the past but also serve as a reminder of why it's vital to preserve what little remains of these shared landscapes for our communities and cultural identity."

Cavers are now being encouraged to report their findings to continue to reveal more about Ingleborough's history.



Nature, farms and flood resilience: muddy boots making progress

Ousewem's work across the Swale catchment is picking up pace, with boots on the ground and tools in hand. Since the start of the year, the teamled locally by the Yorkshire Dales Rivers Trust has been working with farmers, estates and communities to get things done.

Recent work includes 12 scrapes, 15 leaky barriers, willow planting and 650 metres of new hedgerows at the Cragg and Carr. In Wensleydale, five more scrapes have gone in, with fencing, water gates and troughs added to protect floodplain habitat. Flow



monitoring is now underway near Hunton, (left, conducting flow surveys) helping the

team plan what comes next.

Ousewem is also in conversation with upland landowners about how natural flood management can work alongside farming.



Wensleydale Concert Series

It only seems like yesterday I was writing an article about our upcoming 10th anniversary series of concerts and now we come to our final two concerts of the year.

On Saturday 6th September we welcome the return of the world famous Fitzwilliam String Quartet (below). Their last visit



was a truly
memorable
evening of
wonderful
music making
and this
concert will. I

am sure, be moving and equally impressive. The quartet was formed in 1968 and became famous through their close association with the Russian composer Dmitri Shostakovich. They were preferred quartet to give the first performances and make the first recordings of his quartets - indeed the composer was present (along with Benjamin Britten and the great cellist Rostropovich) at a number of the recording sessions. This concert is an opportunity to remember and celebrate Shostakovich's legacy in the 50th year after his death. The music featured includes two of his quartets and music by other composers who influenced him (including Rachmaninoff and Glazunov).

The archaeology and local history group's next regular monthly talk is on Tuesday 9th September, 7.30pm, in Fremington Village Hall, aka Fremington Sunday School. Sue Nicholson will talk about the Marie Hartley collection in the Dales Countryside Museum, Hawes. Marie Hartley, together with her partner Ella Pontefract, and later Joan Ingleby, wrote a large number of books on life in the Dales, including one on Swaledale in 1946. These give an insight into her developing love of the Dales from 1929 onwards and why she and Ella were so enthusiastic about collecting artefacts that reflected traditional dales life and which later developed into the Dales Countryside Museum. hedges have been planted over the last two years by Sustainable Swaledale have been surveyed for tree health, and where required, maintenance either carried out or scheduled. Some sites planted in earlier years have also been surveyed.

For the sites planted over the autumn and winter of 23/24, the success rate is comfortably over 95%.

This year has presented a number of challenges. Prolonged snow cover this winter increased the risk of rabbit damage, and then a very dry and warm spring and early summer made it hard for newly planted trees to find water. Nevertheless, the 24/25 success rate is over 90%.

We found very little sign of disease which is very encouraging, although some hawthorn and oak had mildew, which can happen when it's warm and dry, and can be made worse by tree guards which restrict air flow. None of the affected trees were severely damaged. Overall, our 'crop' is encouragingly healthy.

Yorkshire trials on controlling Himalayan balsam

Trials by Yorkshire Wildlife Trust at locations in West and North Yorkshire of using a pathological rust fungus

found in the Himalayas to tackle the plant's growth have been going well. Generally the weed has to be removed by hand. Himalayan balsam is legally classed as a non-native invasive plant and it is illegal to cultivate, sell, plant or transport it.


23:34 on 17th July we were called by the Police to search for a couple of overdue walkers, 23:36 they turned up safe and sound - possibly one of our shortest searches!


