

More Familiar Faces By John Hunter

We recently looked at one of my favourite westerns, 'Ride the High Country' - and left you all with a picture of one of its leading players. A very familiar face, and a star of several TV comedies, one of which I



clearly remember 'Petticoat Junction'. His name is Edgar Buchanan and he specialised playing drunk judges officials or above) (see and appeared over

hundred films spanning 'Texas' (1941) playing a dentist, 'Shane' (1953) as a settler, crusty through to the comedy 'Move romantic over Darling' (1963) with Rock Hudson and Doris Day. Most at home in westerns however, he found a new fan base in the 1960s appearing in TV shows 'The 'Hopalong Cassidy' and Rifleman', 'Maverick' with James Garner - and if you think 'crossover' episodes between different shows is more of a recent TV. well there was a thing on 'Petticoat Junction' 'Beverly and Hillbillies' crossover back in 1968. His last featured role was a recurring part in the Glen Ford starrer 'Cade's County' in the early 70s.



Also appearing in 'Ride the High Country' as the elder member of the outlaw family is John Anderson (left) probably lesser known than Mr Buchanan, but still recognisable from countless

movies and TV shows. After serving in the US coast guard in WWII, he started out on Broadway (in the original Wagon' cast), 'Paint your progressed to Hollywood, playing the man who sells a car to Marion at the start of Hitchcock's 'Psycho' in 1960. Other notable films from this period include 'The Satan Bug', 'The Hallelujah controversial Trail and western 'Soldier Blue'. Another US TV stalwart. his many appearances included 'Sat 'Have gun, will travel' 'Perry Bilko' Mason' 'Laramie' 'Bonanza' 'The Fugitive' and 'The Untouchables'. He played 'Grandpa' in five episodes of 'MacGyver' and his last appearance was in 'Star Trek, the next generation'. He had a strong similarity to Abraham Lincoln, and played the great man no less than three times.

I often wonder if any of today's character actors will be remembered so affectionately in fifty years' time? I may have cited John Cena until recently, when he has been promoted to some more high profile' starring' roles, but maybe Michael Ironside, Glen Moreshower, Paul Guilfoyle and Xander Berkeley could soon join our illustrious list? (check them out on google!).

Melbecks Emergency Volunteer News for Residents

and Holiday Home Owners.

The Volunteer group has now been running for 3 years, and currently stands at 32 Volunteer members. In times of Storm, flooding, power cuts volunteers action etc. the MELBECKS CIVIL EMERGENCY PLAN. We have Generators which will supply power to the Low Row Institute and Gunnerside Village Hall in the event of protracted power outages, residents somewhere to go in order to stay warm, get hot food and drinks, plus advice and internet services. We have sandbag stores located at the rear of the Low Row Institute, and also behind the Gunnerside Village Hall.

The role of our volunteers is simple: We open up and operate the village halls as emergency rest centres; we check that the routes in and out of the dale are clear in order to support the emergency services; we knock on doors check on potential vulnerable residents: we ligise with the Resilience Emergency Team at Northallerton, and we can (if conditions allow) transport people to the emergency rest centres. Over half of our volunteers are now registered first aiders, and our skill base is growing. As residents, you do not have to worry about the intricacies of the emergency plan. The plan, as it were, will come to YOU! However, it is beneficial to everybody in Melbecks Parish (and Crackpot which is

included in the plan) to be aware of the following;

In relation to storms, prolonged power cuts or flooding, it is good practice to use the Sandbag stores BEFORE storms or flooding hits. It is safer, and a lot easier than waiting until torrents of water are cascading everywhere around you! The bags are free, and you don't need permission to use them, as long as the use is for emergency situations or preparedness. As said, sandbag stores are located behind the Low Row Institute and the Gunnerside Village Hall. At a recent meeting, the subject of Holiday Home (HH) occupiers was raised. At the time of writing, the emergency volunteer group absolutely no way of knowing if HH are occupied, and will therefore only visit properties that we know have people in them. This reduces the risk factor to our volunteers.

However, visitors to the dale will have no idea of what happens, or what to do in the event of power cuts or emergencies and this is of great concern to us. As a rule of thumb, the emergency group will not deploy in the hours of darkness unless there is a specific threat or dire situation developing, as people are generally safer in their own homes. If power is lost at night, and is still off in the morning, then the generators at the Low Row Institute and the Gunnerside Village Hall will be started circa 08:00am to provide, heat, lighting, hot drinks and internet facilities for anyone that needs particularly This is information to have at hand in the event that telephone communications are lost as well.

For Storms/flooding situations, the decision to activate the emergency



Sustainable Swaledale

Friends of the Dales launch Eyes on the Skies campaign

The Friends of the Dales has launched a campaign called Eyes on the Skies, speaking out against the criminal killing of birds of prey. The campaign has the support of several partners including the RSPB and the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority. Birds of prey are in catastrophic decline, especially in the Yorkshire Dales which continues to be a black spot for this type of wildlife crime.

The campaign was announced shortly after the RSPB revealed a hen harrier it monitored had gone missing under "suspicious circumstances" while at a roost site on moorland between Reeth and Redmire (the 29th hen harrier to 'suspiciously disappear' in the National Park since 2015.) In addition, figures from the wildlife charity show that between 2015 and 2024, 67 confirmed or suspected raptor persecution incidents were recorded in or near the Yorkshire Dales National Park.

Friends of the Dales is hoping its Eyes on the Skies campaign will teach people about the importance of the birds to the ecosystem and how to spot suspicious activity. Find out more about their campaign at: https://tinyurl.com/5895565c

Renewables overtake coal as world's biggest source of electricity

For the first time ever, renewables have replaced coal as the world's

leading source of electricity. However, it's a mixed picture globally according to the data: Developing countries, especially China, led the charge in clean energy, while richer nations including the US and EU relied more than before on planet-warming fossil fuels. This divide is likely to get more pronounced as a result of the policies of President Donald Trump's administration which are focused on increasing oil and gas exports.

Yorkshire Dales National Park pressing ahead with plans for new Garsdale to Hawes trail

The National Park Authority is pressing ahead with plans to create an accessible trail along the disused railway line between Garsdale Station and Hawes. In 2022, over 2,300 people took part in a public consultation—one of the most engaged in the Authority's history—with nearly 80% backing the idea of a safe, inclusive route for walkers, wheelchair users, cyclists, and horse

riders.

To keep the project moving, the dedicated Steering Group is now considering a formal Public Creation Order under the Highways Act 1980. This legal process would seek to establish the proposed route as a bridleway. Interested parties submit objections to the Order at this stage.



The archaeology and local history group moved into its now winter programme where our talks are on Zoom and so open to members only. The November talk, on Tuesday 11th is on the Roman Villa excavated recently at Carlisle; 11th December is our Christmas social - soup & puds at Marrick Priory, while the talk in January is about the Archaeology of Peru. 


